The insurance industry has activated a 24-hour disaster hotline for bushfire claims: 1800 734 621.

They can help you with your claim, even if you've lost documents in the fire and can't remember which insurer you're with.

Bushfire-related claims will be prioritised for assistance and processing.

Sorting at your property [7 of 8]

Waste

- You can **sort your waste into streams** (only if you're able to, and it's safe to do so).
- Only handle confirmed 'asbestos free' waste like metal, plastic, timber, and building materials.
- Be aware of clearance and access to your property and your waste.
- Trucks may require overhead clearance, so make sure you store waste items close to the boundary, and where access is clear.

Belongings

- Your insurance company, or local recovery groups, may have reason to encourage you to stay away from your property.
- If you choose to look for recoverable items on your property, please use protective clothing, including masks and gloves.
- Only handle confirmed 'asbestos free' materials.
- As at January 7 2020, Team Rubicon Australia indicated that it would be responding to those affected by recent bushfires in the Cudlee Creek region of South Australia. More information can be found at their Facebook page.
