Dear Mr Whetstone

I refer to your application (receipt number 18085134) pursuant to the *Freedom of Information Act* 1991 (the FOI Act) on 24 July 2023 requesting access to:

A copy of all documents and correspondence (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters, meeting agendas, diary entries, event attendance records and any other correspondence) relating to Johns Lyng Group between 17 November 2022 and 3 January 2023

Due to a determination not being provided within the statutory timeframe, you sought an internal review on 24 August 2023. Green Industries SA (GISA) has confirmed with your office that an internal review determination will be provided regarding this application.

A total of 17 documents were identified within the scope of your application. These are listed in the enclosed schedule. The information contained in the documents has been reviewed under the provisions of the FOI Act and the views of parties consulted under Division 2 have also been considered.

As Principal Officer, I have determined to apply the following exemption clauses under Schedule 1 of the FOI Act to several documents, in consideration of balancing public interest:

- 7(1) Documents affecting business affairs: a) in relation to trade secrets, b) in relation to destroying or diminishing commercial value of information, and c) in relation to prejudicing the future supply of such information to the government
- 13(1) Documents containing confidential information: b) in relation to breaching information obtained in confidence and prejudice the future supply of such information to the government

My determination is to grant full access to 11 documents, partial access to 1 document and refuse access to 5 documents, under the above exemption clauses. Where access has been granted, copies of the documents are enclosed with this determination. Several details – such as mobile contact numbers – have been redacted as not relevant to the application and determination.

In accordance with the FOI Act and *Freedom of Information (Fees and Charges) Regulations 2018* in relation to applications from Members of Parliament, no amount is payable for the costs associated with this determination.

Pursuant to section 39 the FOI Act, if you are dissatisfied with this determination, you have the right to apply to Ombudsman SA for an external review. You have 30 days from the date on which you receive this letter to apply for an external review. Please find attached an initial proposal to support SA Government's flood recovery efforts. Although we can provide a range of recovery solutions, this proposal focuses on:

- 1. (Page 8-9) Flood Property Assessment Program which provides detailed building inspections to assist residents identify damage and understand recommended repairs, with estimated costs. The program also provides Government with very detailed data on impacts.
- 2. (Page 10-11) Habitable repairs program which kick-starts recovery by assisting residents restore their homes to a habitable state. Programs can be modified based on need. A more limited program may focus on hazard remediation and repairing electricals. A more complete program may include re-sheeting walls and restoring basic kitchen and bathroom facilities. Ultimately, providing early support to assist residents return to their homes reduces ongoing demand for government assistance.
- 3. **(Page 12) Coordinated waste management program** which provides support to Local and State Government to clean-up debris and dispose waste safely and efficiently. Coordinated waste management also minimises community and environmental hazards posed by contaminants.

Disaster Management Australia is already providing each of these programs to support government flood recovery efforts in NSW and Victoria. All programs are eligible for Cth co-funding through DRFA.

High-level estimated costs have been provided in the proposal to support initial planning discussions with Finance, however programs typically operate on a cost-plus model based on a fixed schedule of rates. This provides flexibility given impacts of the event and demand from residents are unknown. If required, we can provide a more thorough breakdown of costs, as well as proposed program scopes based on recent flood recovery experience.

Thanks for meeting with Kirsten and I yesterday.

Is it possible to get a quote from you ...we would be looking at the Flood property assessment program and Habitable repairs program (Temporary accommodation is being covered by Housing SA at this stage; and we are not sure of the need for Demolition program as yet).

As you can appreciate it is difficult to give you concrete parameters but it could include:

- 1. Residential (homes) disaster waste from houses including asbestos (removal and air monitoring). Includes sheds. Likely to include some demolition and removal of whole structures.
- 2. Shacks disaster waste including asbestos (removal and air monitoring). Includes sheds. Likely to include some demolition and removal of whole structures.
- 3. Businesses (of all sizes) disaster waste including asbestos (removal and air monitoring). Includes sheds. May include demolition and removal of whole structures. Includes Commercial, Agricultural, Horticultural, Industrial, Mooring, Reserve, Vacant/recent builds.
- 4. Local government sites includes caravan parks, wastewater treatment plants, parks and gardens, roadsides. May include asbestos (removal and air monitoring).
- 5. State government sites includes roadsides, conservation parks, crown land, Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) land
- 6. Other infrastructure miscellaneous debris from upstream, vegetation, cars from upstream, 'other'

Project Management / Overheads should be included too.

### In terms of <u>Liquid waste management</u>:

It is assumed that most sites can simply be pumped out. Every septic tank however will need to be pumped out and treated as contaminated (?).



Please find **attached** an initial proposal to support SA Government's flood recovery efforts. Although we can provide a range of recovery solutions, this proposal focuses on:

1. **(Page 8-9) Flood Property Assessment Program** – which provides detailed building inspections to assist residents identify damage and understand recommended repairs, with estimated costs. The program also provides Government with very detailed data on impacts.

- 2. (Page 10-11) Habitable repairs program which kick-starts recovery by assisting residents restore their homes to a habitable state. Programs can be modified based on need. A more limited program may focus on hazard remediation and repairing electricals. A more complete program may include re-sheeting walls and restoring basic kitchen and bathroom facilities. Ultimately, providing early support to assist residents return to their homes reduces ongoing demand for government assistance.
- 3. **(Page 12) Coordinated waste management program** which provides support to Local and State Government to clean-up debris and dispose waste safely and efficiently. Coordinated waste management also minimises community and environmental hazards posed by contaminants.

Disaster Management Australia is already providing each of these programs to support government flood recovery efforts in NSW and Victoria. All programs are eligible for Cth co-funding through DRFA.

High-level estimated costs have been provided in the proposal to support initial planning discussions with Finance, however programs typically operate on a cost-plus model based on a fixed schedule of rates. This provides flexibility given impacts of the event and demand from residents are unknown. If required, we can provide a more thorough breakdown of costs, as well as proposed program scopes based on recent flood recovery experience.

Thanks for meeting with Kirsten and I yesterday.

Is it possible to get a quote from you ...we would be looking at the Flood property assessment program and Habitable repairs program (Temporary accommodation is being covered by Housing SA at this stage; and we are not sure of the need for Demolition program as yet).

As you can appreciate it is difficult to give you concrete parameters but it could include:

1. Residential (homes) – disaster waste from houses including asbestos (removal and air monitoring). Includes sheds. Likely to include some demolition and removal of whole structures.

- 3. Businesses (of all sizes) disaster waste including asbestos (removal and air monitoring). Includes sheds. May include demolition and removal of whole structures. Includes Commercial, Agricultural, Horticultural, Industrial, Mooring, Reserve, Vacant/recent builds.
- 4. Local government sites includes caravan parks, wastewater treatment plants, parks and gardens, roadsides. May include asbestos (removal and air monitoring).
- 5. State government sites includes roadsides, conservation parks, crown land, Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) land
- 6. Other infrastructure miscellaneous debris from upstream, vegetation, cars from upstream, 'other'

Project Management / Overheads should be included too.

#### In terms of <u>Liquid waste management</u>:

Apologies for the slow reply – yes, managed to have a few relaxing days with the family. I hope you managed to have break as well!

Its difficult to prevent some residents from commencing their own DIY clean-up/muck-out of their homes – its best to expect it will happen to some degree. Telling these residents to not re-enter their home just sets them up to disregard govt advice from the get-go of the recovery.

From experience, the best move at this point is communicate clearly and early with the community – across radio and social channels – that govt will be coordinating a clean-up program. This should include:

- 1. the hazards/risks in re-entering/mucking-out flood affected homes without it being inspected;
- 2. What the clean-up program is/what is the process;
- 3. How to register/indication on timings.

If the community understands this program is occurring, they are more likely to hold off on a DIY muck-out and participate in the govt program.

In respect to previous floods, residents doing their own muck-out usually just dump waste on the curb to be collected by govt contractors. Once a clean-up program kicks-off, its also preferable to minimise civilian light vehicle traffic to waste transfer stations when there is a high level of heavy vehicle movement. One way to manage this is to only extend waste levy discounts to waste through the govt clean-up program (perhaps apart from rural properties/some commercial operators etc).
